

## **PLEASE READ THIS BEFORE YOU COMMENCE PLAY**

### **Skirmish Paintball Games High Wycombe**

Paintball is an active sporting pursuit involving the elimination of opponents by firing paintballs from a paintball marker. Skirmish High Wycombe (“Skirmish”) is committed to ensuring that you have a safe and enjoyable experience. For your own safety and for the safety of other players and Skirmish staff you are required to read and observe the following rules (“the Rules”) prior to commencing play. If you have any questions on the Rules or any other aspect of the game then please put all your queries to the Site Marshals who will already have identified themselves to you or will do so before you commence play. The Site Marshals will be responsible for conducting all games and enforcing the Rules.

### **THE SITE RULES**

#### **Players Must:**

1. Listen to and observe all instructions provided by the Site Marshals before, during and after a game and in particular the safety speech provided before the first game
2. Wear coveralls, hood and goggles as provided when on a paintball site (this is not required when in the designated safe areas).
3. Not take a paintball marker into a safe area nor fire a paintball marker towards a safe area.
4. Not fire a paintball marker at an individual who is less than 15ft from the marker.
5. Not aim or fire at another players head neck or groin area.
6. Act responsibly and with due care and attention and take all reasonable precautions to prevent harm to themselves or other players or Skirmish staff
7. Not to consume intoxicating liquor while participating in the paintball event.
8. Immediately report any incident in which you or another player appears to have suffered any form of injury during the course of a game.

#### **Please Note.**

Skirmish reserves the right to remove individuals who fail to abide by any of the Rules or in the opinion of the Site Marshals are a danger to themselves and/or any other players or staff

Players are advised not to carry or wear valuable items such as (but not limited to) cameras, watches, car keys, mobile phones and jewellery.
